

English - Stories from other Cultures

Children will use the novel The Firework Maker's Daughter as a reference. We will explore characters, plot and make inferences and predictions. Children will write their own versions of the book using a variety of openers, clauses and conjunctions.

Hybrid text Information/Explanation Text - Children will look at various ways to present information about lifecycles that will compliment our science topic.

Science- Living things and their habitats

Children will be learning about the need for reproduction in all living things and comparing lifecycles of various animals, including humans. We will also investigate how flowering and non-flowering plants reproduce by use of pollination and seed dispersal.

Maths

Place value—Children will learn the value of digits and to compare and order numbers.

Addition and subtraction - children will learn formal written methods, then develop reasoning and problem solving skills.

Geography

National Parks of the UK

Children will locate the National Parks, learn about the physical features of them, as well as the similarities and differences between National Parks in the UK.

Transport—Use the verb **aller** in the present tense to ask for and give information about how people travel.

RE—Hinduism

Children will analyse Hindu beliefs about samsara, karma and moksha and how these are linked. Children will explain how reincarnation might affect the way in which a Hindu views the 'journey of life'.

Music - Rainforests

Children will use their bodies and tuned percussions to replicate sounds heard in the rainforest. They will create repeated patterns and explore ways to improve their compositions before performing.
