Science

Light- Can we see in the dark?

Explore: how different objects are more or less visible in different levels of lighting, how objects with different surfaces are more or less visible, how shadows vary as the distance between a light source and an object or surface is changed, shadows which are connected to and disconnected from the object. Choose suitable materials to make shadow puppets and create artwork.

Maths

Place Value

Represent, partition, compare and order numbers to 10,000. Estimate their positions on a number line. Read and use Roman Numerals. To round numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000.

Addition and Subtraction

To add and subtract 1s, 10s, 100s and 1000s. To add and subtract up to 4 digit numbers with exchange. To estimate and check answers carefully and accurately.

History - Stone Age to Iron Age

How did Britain change from the Stone Age to the Iron Age?

A study of Stone Age life, achievements and their influence on the western world. Children will know and understand significant aspects of the history of the wider world including the nature of ancient civilisations.

RE—Hindu Dharma

What might a Hindu learn through celebrating Diwali?

To explore the symbolism of light in the story of Rama and Sita, identifying what moral guidance they might learn, understand Diwali celebrations, and to discuss what gives them hope during difficult times.

Music—Indian Instrumentals.

Traditional instruments and improvisation

To know that Indian music uses all of the sounds in between the 12 'notes' that we are used to in western music. To play and improvise in groups.

PSHE—Health and Well being

What strengths, skills and interests do we have?
